Sweet Update

Dear Neighbors and Friends,

I wanted to wish you and your family a wonderful 2025 as we go forward with this new year.

While I have been out meeting residents around the Village, I realize that we are blessed with a lot of new residents that have moved into our Village in the last four years.

Some of you may not be aware that when I was sworn in during my first term in April 2019, we enacted the "Guiding Principles". This is a simple document that I felt would help the community understand how the Board, various Commissions and staff work to serve you

I have included a copy of this document for your convenience in this newsletter.

In addition, the Board has adopted a Civility Pledge we renew every two years, or when new Trustees join the Board, detailing how the Village operates.

The Village of North Barrington believes that everyone, including our staff, should be treated with dignity, kindness and respect.

In 2023 while I was going door to door, I shared with some of the residents that I was a "volunteer President (Mayor)". This seemed to be "new" information to many people I met.

The Village President and Board of Trustees are all elected positions without compensation working as volunteers. This has been true since the Village was incorporated (founded) in 1959. In Illinois, municipalities are generally either a city or village. Although they are different names, there is no difference in power given by the state of Illinois. Municipalities incorporated as a Village (North Barrington) are typically governed by a president and trustees that are elected by district or at-large. The president and trustees in North Barrington are elected at-large. Conversely, cities are generally governed by a mayor and alderpersons that may be elected by district or at large.

Like most corporations in the private sector, the Village President operates as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO).

Our President, along with the Board of Trustees is the legislative side of North Barrington's Village governance primarily charged with setting policy and approving expenditures of money. Approval of expenditure begins with the approval of the annual budget.

The staff, led by the Village Administrator, is appointed by the Village President with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees. The authority given to the Administrator can be found in the Village Code. The Administrator can be thought of as the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO). This position is appointed, not elected and is a compensated position, not voluntary. The compensation is set by the President and Board of Trustees. The Administrator of the Village is charged with implementing decisions of the elected officials and manages the day-to-day operation of the Village.

I expect 2025 to be an exciting year for the Village of North Barrington.

- 1. We will keep you posted as we continue to move forward with the GHO (Grassmere, Haverton, Oaksbury) Stormwater project. I expect an update for you this spring after the necessary easements have been secured.
- 2. In addition, we will update the residents this summer regarding the development and implementation of the 5-Year Master Park & Recreation Plan that has been initiated.

I would like to at this time thank all the Environmental and Health Commission, Parks and Recreation Commission, Plan Commission, and Zoning Board of Appeals members for all their wonderful volunteer help during 2024 and this upcoming year.

for all the hard work we are all doing together to help make the Village of North Barrington a better place to live.

Board Meeting Highlights & Updates

Leonard Park Walking Path: The Board of Trustees approved a contract to install a gravel walking path through Leonard Park. This project was part of the Parks & Recreation Commission's Five-Year Master Plan.

Street Program: This past summer, 1.24 miles of streets were repaved as part of the Villages bi-annual street maintenance program.

Trustee Appointments: The Board of Trustees confirmed the Village Presidents appointment of Trustee Sarah L. Creviston and Rick Mignano to fill two Trustee vacancies on the Village Board.

Zoning Ordinance Update: The Village Board approved a professional services agreement with Camiros, Ltd., to assist the Village in updating the Village Zoning Codes. There will be a comprehensive review of all zoning regulations.

Environmental and Health Commission Update

The Environmental and Health Commission hosted a well-attended resident Garden Walk. The event will be held again in 2025 due to its success. The Village will begin accepting resident registrations in the Spring of 2025 for residents that would like to submit their garden for consideration for the 2025 Garden Walk.



Parks and Recreation Commission Updates

The Commission hosts annually at Eton Park, a four-part Summer Concerts Series as well as the Annual Fall Festival which had a record number of attendees. This year the Commission oversaw the installation of an updated Nature Trail in Leonard Park. The Commission is in the final phase of engaging a consultant to develop a 5-year Comprehensive Master Parks and Recreation Plan. 

Snow and Ice Control Operations

The Village contracts with Alan Horticulture LLC who purchased Mac's Property Management Services this year. If you need to contact them, please call Alan Horticulture at 815-943-4470 ext. 113 or Village Hall during regular business hours; M-F 8:30 am – 4:00 pm at (847) 381-6000.

- Non-Village Streets: Not all streets and/or highways in the Village of North Barrington are under Village control. The Village does not provide snow and Ice control on the following streets and/or highways. Please contact the following agencies if you have questions regarding snow and ice control operations.

THE FARE IS \$2.00.

COST SHARE TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

The Village established a cost share tree planting policy on private property in North Barrington. The Village recognizes the importance trees have in the community. The planting of trees provides benefits to the community including improved property values, reduction in carbon dioxide, provides food and shelter for wildlife, stabilizes soil from erosion, has a cooling effect through transpiration, and provides a natural buffer between homes and roadways.

A resident may request financial reimbursement from the Village for the planting of a tree on private property located within the Village. The Village will reimburse the property owner up to 50% of the actual cost of the purchase and planting of the tree or \$300, whichever amount is less. Upon application, the following program guidelines shall apply:

- The quote must be from a nursery engaged in the business of selling and planting trees and include a one-year guarantee. The quote shall include the cost of the tree, species of the tree, caliper of the tree (minimum of 2 inches), planting cost and the one-year guarantee.
- The tree planting location must be marked by the owner and utilities located by JULIE, planted in the front or side yard, not located in the ROW and approved by the Village Forester.
- Applications will be first come first served and reimbursement is subject to the availability of Village funds.
- Homeowners are eligible for the program every other year.
